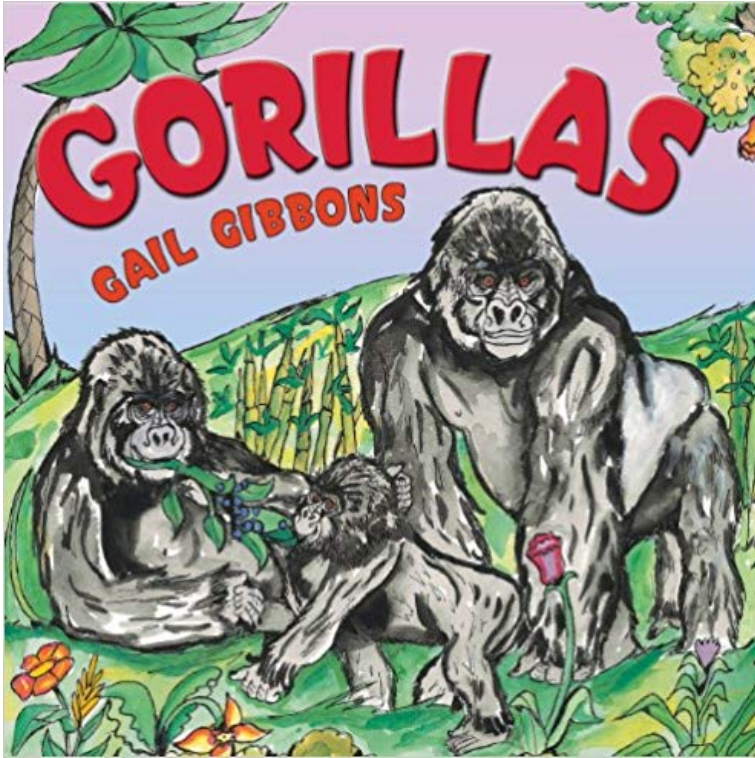


Gorillas
