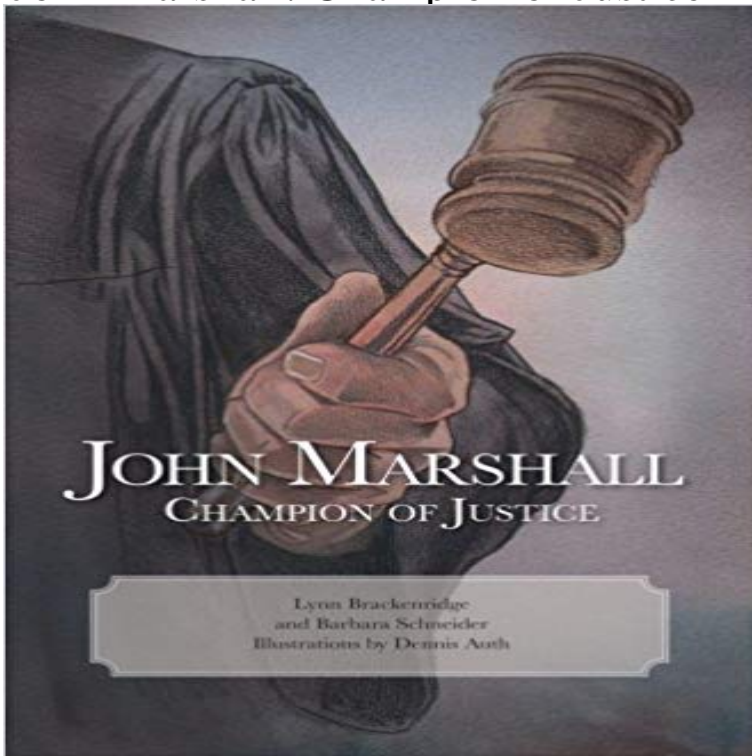


John Marshall: Champion of Justice
