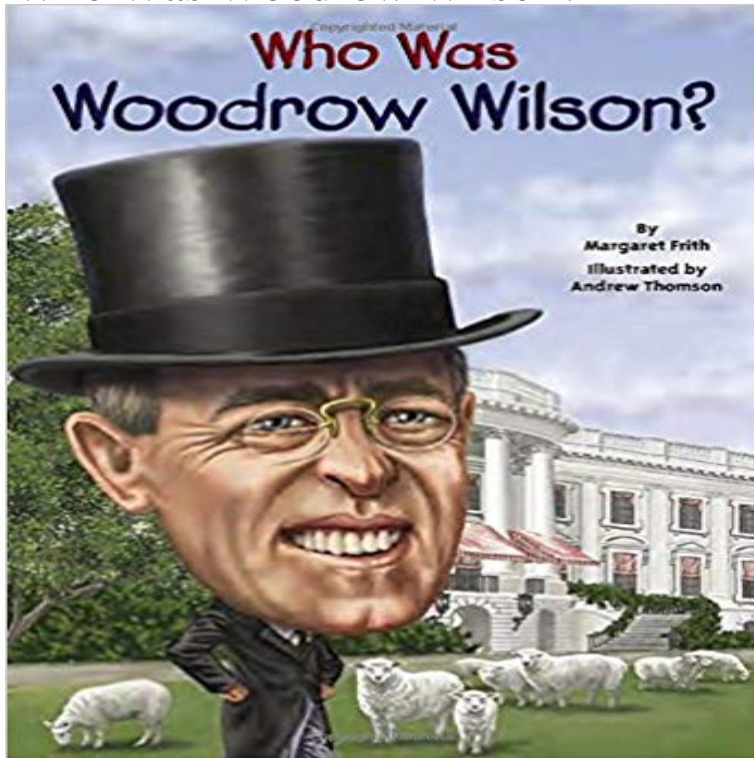


## Who Was Woodrow Wilson?
